Funding is for fiscal year 2027 (July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027).

Missoula County conducted a housing and community development survey to help identify needs and gaps in services related to public infrastructure and facilities, economic development and housing. The survey opened on March 2 and closed on March 31. Residents are welcome to the public presentation on survey findings at 2 p.m. Thursday, April 23. VIII. Unfinished Business

- a. **Missoula Growth Policy/Lolo Regional Plan Update Standing Agenda Item**
 - i. Missoula County is in the beginning stage of developing a countywide comprehensive plan for the unincorporated parts of the county. Unincorporated areas include anywhere outside Missoula city limits but within Missoula County.

A comprehensive plan provides a legal foundation necessary for the development of responsible policy and regulations. It will address a number of community concerns, including how communities would like to grow and develop and what services they would like to see.

The County originally adopted a comprehensive plan in 1975, and the comprehensive planning document currently in use was adopted in 2016, with a substantial amendment in 2019. The process of updating the plan will be a two-year process that will likely continue into 2027. Public engagement for this process is planned to begin in the fall of 2026.
